Blended Combined Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) and Paediatric First Aid (PFA)



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Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) and Paediatric First Aid (PFA)

This 2 part course is ideal for people who work and deal with first aid for children as well as with first aid at work incidents for adults, and enables them to be a workplace First-Aider under the Health and Safety (First Aid) regulations 1981, and a Paediatric First-Aider under the requirements of The Early Years Foundation Stage.

Part 1: Learners complete an interactive e-learning module, at their own pace. It will take approximately 6 hours to complete. At the end of the module, learners do a multiple-choice assessment

Part 2: This is a one-day interactive practical session on skills learned on the elearning module. This will involve formative assessment whereby question answer sessions will take place along with practical demonstrations.

- Incident and Casualty Assessment
- Dealing with an Unconscious Casualty
- Asthma
- Minor Injuries
- Eyes, Ears and Nose injuries
- Hypoxia
- Chest Injuries
- Fractures, Dislocations, Sprains and Strains
- Diabetes
- Poisonous Substances
- Body Temperature
- CPR and AED use for babies, children and adults
- Choking for babies, children and adults
- Anaphylaxis and use of adrenaline auto-injectors
- Shock
- External Bleeding
- Burns
- Hyperventilation
- Heart Problems and Stroke
- Epilepsy and Seizures (inc febrile convulsions)
- Meningitis
- Electric Shock
- Head and Spinal Injuries

Duration: Approximately 7 hours

Access: This online course can be completed on any PC or mobile device. Learners can study at their own pace and log in and out as often as they wish.

Features:

1. Appeals to all learning styles with interactive quizzes, video and audio features
2. Allows learners to work at their own pace, testing their knowledge as they progress through the course
3. Provides a very thorough resource for those with English as a Second Language to equip them with the vocabulary, language skills and confidence to pass a practical course.

Assessment*: Self checks after each section of the course and an end of course multiple-choice assessment.

Certification: On successful completion, learners can download a certificate as evidence that they have passed the course.
